House Vote 1 — S. 24: Federal Employee Backpay for Shutdown

Jan. 11, 2019 — The bill requires the federal government to provide retroactive pay to employees who were furloughed or working without compensation during a government shutdown and requires that they be compensated at the earliest possible date once the shutdown has concluded, regardless of regularly scheduled pay dates.

Passed 411-7. **NTEU Position: YEA**

House Vote 2 — H.R. 790: Pay Increase for Civilian Federal Employees

Jan. 30, 2019 — The bill would provide all civilian federal employees a 2.6 percent increase for calendar year 2019. The pay raise would take effect immediately upon enactment and would be backdated to apply to the first pay period that occurred after Jan. 1.

Passed 259-161. **NTEU Position: YEA**

House Vote 3 — H. Res. 79: Congressional Disapproval of Shutdowns

Jan. 30, 2019 — A resolution to express the sense of the House of Representatives that government shutdowns cause substantial damage to federal employees, to Americans generally, to the U.S. economy and to the nation's reputation and to make it clear that shutting down the U.S. government "is not an acceptable tactic or strategy" for resolving policy differences.

Rejected 249-163. **NTEU Position: YEA**

Note: This bill was considered under a suspension of the rules, which requires a two-thirds majority of those present and voting (275 in this case) to pass.

House Vote 4 — H.J. Res. 31: Ending Partial Government Shutdown

Feb. 14, 2019 — Legislation providing \$333 billion in full-year funding for the agencies and programs under the seven remaining unfunded Fiscal Year (FY) 2019 appropriations bills: Agriculture; Commerce-Justice-Science; Financial Services; Homeland Security; Interior-Environment; State-Foreign Operations; and Transportation-Housing and Urban Development. This bill ensured federal employees would not face another shutdown in FY 2019 and overturned the president's pay freeze to provide a retroactive average 1.9 percent pay increase for federal employees for 2019.

Passed 300-128. **NTEU Position: YEA**

House Vote 5 — H.R. 1500: Restrict Funding for Consumer Financial Protection

May 22, 2019 — An amendment by Rep. Burgess (R-TX) that would set the CFPB apart from other independent banking agencies by subjecting funding for the CFPB to congressional appropriations.

Rejected 192-235. **NTEU Position: NAY**

House Vote 6 — H.R. 3401: Supplemental DHS Appropriations

June 25, 2019 — Legislation providing emergency border funding for the remainder of FY 2019. This bill included \$45 million to fund overtime and travel costs related to ongoing redeployment of CBP Officers from ports nationwide to address the situation at the U.S. southern border.

Passed 230-195. **NTEU Position: YEA**

House Vote 7 — H.R. 3351: Cut Funding to Treasury, SEC, FCC, FEC and other agencies

June 26, 2019 — An amendment by Rep. Grothman (R-WI) that would reduce all discretionary funding in the bill that funds the Treasury Department, SEC, FCC, FEC and agencies relating to federal personnel by 3.1 percent.

Rejected 151-274. **NTEU Position: NAY**

House Vote 8 — H.R. 3877: Two-Year Budget Deal, Ending Sequestration

July 25, 2019 — Legislation establishing new budget levels for Fiscal Years (FY) 2020 and 2021 that increased discretionary budget caps for defense and non-defense spending, ending the threat of sequestration, and suspended the public debt limit through July 31, 2021. By ending sequestration, it ensured that agencies will not suffer across the board cuts that would result in furloughs or RIFs. It also extended authorization for processing fees on certain customs services through FY 2029.

Passed 284-149. **NTEU Position: YEA**

House Vote 9 — H.R. 3: Drug Price Negotiation — Federal Health Plan Contracts

Dec. 12, 2019 — An amendment by Rep. Luria (D-VA) that would prohibit OPM from contracting with a health benefits plan if the plan carrier has elected not to participate in the fair price negotiation program established by the bill.

Adopted 231-192. **NTEU Position: YEA**

House Vote 10 — H.R. 1865: Preventing Government Shutdown

Dec. 17, 2019 — Funding legislation for FY 2020 that avoids a government shutdown and provides approximately \$540 billion in discretionary funding for agencies and programs covered by eight of the 12 FY 2020 appropriations bills: Labor-HHS-Education, Agriculture, Energy-Water, Interior-Environment, Legislative Branch, Military Construction-VA, State-Foreign Operations, and Transportation-HUD. It also eliminates a number of health care-related taxes, including the tax on high-cost employer-sponsored health care plans (the so-called “Cadillac Tax”).

Agreed to 297-120. **NTEU Position: YEA**

House Vote 11 — H.R. 1158: Preventing Government Shutdown/Pay Raise

Dec. 17, 2019 — Funding legislation providing \$860.3 billion in discretionary spending for agencies and programs covered by four of the 12 Fiscal Year 2020 appropriations bills: Defense, Homeland Security, Commerce-Justice-Science, and Financial Services. It also provides federal civilian employees and all members of the armed forces with an average 3.1percent pay increase.

Agreed to 280-138. **NTEU Position: YEA**
