SENATE VOTE 1: HR 2872: Fiscal Year 2024 Continuing Resolution — Passage

January 18, 2024 — Passage of the bill that extended stopgap funding and prevent a government shutdown through March 1, 2024, for agencies and programs funded by the Agriculture, Energy-Water, Military Construction-VA and Transportation-HUD spending bills; and extended funding through March 8, 2024, for agencies and programs funded by the Commerce-Justice-Science, Defense, Financial Services, Homeland Security, Interior-Environment, Labor-HHS-Education, Legislative Branch and State-Foreign Operations spending bills.

Passed 77-18

SENATE VOTE 2: HR 815: Border and Foreign Aid Supplemental Appropriations — Cloture

February 7, 2024 — Motion to invoke cloture (cut off debate and vote) on the bill to increase funding for CBP as part of a bipartisan border bill.

Motion rejected 49-50

SENATE VOTE 3: Dellinger OSC Nomination — Confirmation

February 27, 2024 — Confirmation of President Joe Biden’s nomination of Hampton Y. Dellinger to be Special Counsel of the Office of Special Counsel

SENATE VOTE 4 Cathy Harris MSPB Nomination — Confirmation

March 6, 2024 — Confirmation of President Joe Biden’s nomination of Cathy Ann Harris to be chairman of the Merit Systems Protection Board.

SENATE VOTE 5: HR 4366: Fiscal Year 2024 Consolidated Appropriations — Cloture

March 08, 2024 — Motion to invoke cloture (cut off debate and vote) on the motion to concur in the House amendment to the Senate amendment to the FY 2024 Consolidated Appropriations Act.

Motion agreed to 63-35

SENATE VOTE 6: HR 4366: Fiscal Year 2024 Consolidated Appropriations — Passage

March 08, 2024 — Vote on passage of the Fiscal Year 2024 Consolidated Appropriations Act that provided \$467.5 billion for the remainder of the fiscal year for agencies and programs funded by the Agriculture, Energy-Water, Military Construction-VA, Transportation-HUD, Commerce-Justice-Science, and Interior-Environment spending bills, avoiding a government shutdown.

Passed 75-22

SENATE VOTE 7: HR 2882: Fiscal Year 2024 Further Consolidated Appropriations — Passage

March 23, 2024 — Vote on passage of the bill that provided \$1.2 trillion for the remainder of the fiscal year for agencies and programs funded by the Defense, Financial Services, Homeland Security, Legislative Branch, Labor-HHS-Education, and State-Foreign Operations spending bills, avoiding a government shutdown.

Passed 74-24

SENATE VOTE 8: Wagner FLRA Nomination — Confirmation

July 10, 2024 — Confirmation of President Joe Biden’s nomination of Anne Marie Wagner to be a member of the Federal Labor Relations Authority.

Confirmed 55-37

SENATE VOTE 9: HR 82: Repeal Provisions That Reduce Social Security Benefits for Public Workers and Families (GPO/WEP) — Passage

December 21, 2024 — Passage of the bill that repealed provisions known as the Government Pension Offset (GPO) and the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) that reduce Social Security benefits for individuals who receive a government pension or disability benefit from an employer who did not withhold Social Security taxes. Changes are retroactive to benefits payable after December 2023.

Passed 76-20

SENATE VOTE 10: HR 10545: Fiscal Year 2025 Continuing Resolution — Passage

December 21, 2024 — Passage of the bill that continued funding for the federal government at current levels through March 14, 2025, thereby avoiding a government shutdown.
